### **05/01 Opening Minute**

We welcome each other to a new year and to YFGM here in Newcastle. We look forward to getting to know one another and having fun on several different levels. We particularly welcome the participants on our Enquirers' Gathering and wish them a fruitful weekend.

### **05/02 Planning Weekend minutes**

We have listened to Eudora and Juliette's report from the January Planning Weekend. We will discuss P05/05 further during the weekend. With the exception of this minute, we adopt the minutes from the weekend as YFGM minutes. They will be attached to the minutes of this meeting.

### **05/03 Our Faith**

Nessa Grimes and Mark Russ have introduced an interactive session giving us space to share and discuss what we believe and what prophecies we would like to make.

We will have the opportunity to see what each other have written.

Our beliefs are very personal to us and although we are each unique, as Quakers there are a lot of beliefs we share. YFGM hasn't spent much time recently contemplating such basics, and we have valued this activity.

#### **05/04 Who do you think we are? YFGM and BYM**

Nick Sturge and Simon Best facilitated a session exploring the nature of the links between YFGM and Britain Yearly Meeting. We used imaginary scenarios to help us think about how YFGM relates to Britain Yearly Meeting and vice versa.

#### **05/05 2005 Budget**

Huw Still, our Treasurer, has prepared us a budget for 2005, a copy of which is attached. We approve this budget and thank Huw and Finance Committee for their work in preparing this on our behalf.

#### **05/06 Exploring Sexuality**

Anna Sharman has led us in a consideration of sexuality. Sexuality is more than just sexual orientation, it can be described as 'whatever turns you on'. Whilst our sexuality is not under our control, our responses to it are.

We have heard some Young Friends' stories, and done a brainstorm on what influences, pressures and messages we receive about sex and sexuality. We have continued this consideration in small group discussions.

Our sexuality has close links with our spirituality, and this theme has shone through in our session, with our thoughts resting on love, tolerance, choice, and how we treat each other; all strong facets of our Quakerism.

We have greatly valued this chance to openly share a subject that is very personal, important to us, and seldom spoken aloud. Our Quaker way is to be open, accepting, and explore our individual responses for ourselves, finding much common ground. We feel that if this approach were taken more often towards sexuality, then many of the troubles associated with this subject would be diminished.

#### **05/07 Recast report**

Further to minute 05/02, a special interest group has met to consider issues that have arisen resulting from P05/05, which appears indented below.

##### **P05/05 RECAST report**

During our YFGM Planning Weekend 7<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> January 2005 we have struggled with the report by the Working Group on Representation, Accountability and Communication in our Structures (RECAST) and have spent much of our session time considering this matter.

The RECAST report has been sent out to Meeting for Sufferings, however our RECAST representative Jenny Moy was not able to agree the report as she felt it lacked enough detail on the proposals on central structures. This may seem like a minor problem but we have greater concern regarding the way RECAST arrived at its decisions.

We have heard from Jenny about the procedure in completing the report and feel it did not uphold the Quaker business method as we understand it;

such as asking RECAST to agree the entire minutes of the meeting en bloc at the end of a meeting. This has happened repeatedly including in a residential meeting in February 2004 and on 7th January 2005. The meeting on 7th January included a minute agreeing the RECAST report. Some members of the group had already left at his point.

With a heavy heart we feel we must forward our concerns on this to Meeting for Sufferings, BYM Agenda Committee and RECAST.

This minute was not received by Meeting for Sufferings or Britain Yearly Meeting agenda committee because it was not a minute of YFGM in full session. However, key people involved in taking the RECAST report forward have heard the concerns the Planning Weekend minute raised. Esther Boyd and Gavin Burnell from the RECAST group talked to the special interest group to respond to our concerns.

We will discuss the relationship between YFGM, Planning Weekends and other parts of BYM at the next Planning Weekend with a view to being more clear about what the Planning Weekend can do. We look forward to considering the RECAST report's proposals in detail at our May YFGM.

We will send this minute to the recording clerk's office and to RECAST for information.
