We have come together this weekend for YFGM in Norwich to celebrate our community, spirituality and faith in action.

We heard from Christine Putz and Catherine Habgood from Central Nominations Committee about the opportunities available for services in the wider Quaker community. We were asked to discuss the barriers to younger friends serving on wider committees and to consider possible solutions. This sparked some interesting discussions around age and skills and how service may change throughout our lives. Christine and Catherine encouraged all members of YFGM to consider sharing their skills, now or in the future.

Once again our special interest groups reflected the varied interests of YFGM. Work continues on our concerns, with Becky Riddell leading a session on Mental Wellbeing, whilst the Trident working group led a session on writing letters to those in power.

We further considered speaking truth to power with a session on using your vote to express your faith in action, led by Lesley Grahame.

Paul Parker asked us to consider membership and to explore young friends' views on becoming members of BYM. We also heard from Hugh Jones and James Surry from Quaker Lesbian and Gay Fellowship. We celebrated the progress that has been made towards equality through equal marriage, but were reminded that there is still work to be done to create true equality across Quakers. The group discussed possible links between YFGM and QLGF in the future.

We also found time for quiet reflection with a session on worship sharing led by Becky Riddell and a chance to explore Norwich.

Throughout the weekend we have enjoyed living as a community – sharing our joys, worries and hopes over meals, cups of tea and games. Overseers provided us with a fun and lively entertainments session, testing our ability to describe film, music and Quaker jargon through drawing, mime, fast-talking and play-dough modelling. Feeling the tension of competing against each other and the clock, our teams bonded through laughter, frustration and the satisfaction of getting a tricky answer.

Our individual images were drawn together into a mandala: a circle representing wholeness around which the community gathered to reflect; while Rajit Gholap invited us to explore the oneness between body and spirit through yogic movement and stillness.

We are deeply grateful for the fellowship and community we experience at YFGM – having the space to lovingly uphold one another is a precious gift. We give thanks for this weekend, and look forward to meeting again at Leicester in May.
