

Being a Trustee of Young Friends General Meeting

Purpose

Part of a team of eight trustees who are legally and financially responsible for YFGM.

Duties

- To maintain interest in and awareness of the work of all officers and to form a supportive network. Equally to support the administrator.
- To try and be aware of the variety of opinions and concerns within General Meeting, and to try to foster the expression of these within General Meeting. To share insights with others.
- To report to YFGM via Young Quaker or a report at General Meeting on important parts of the work.

What you could gain

- Experience of charity management in a legally responsible role
- A chance to see the inner working of YFGM in all areas

Skills Required

An understanding of the legal issues associated with running YFGM as a whole or a willingness to learn.

Time Commitment

To attend all Planning Weekends and YFGMs and an additional trustees weekend.

Probably less than an hour a week staying in contact with the other trustees and the committees that they oversee.

Other Requirements

Before becoming a trustee, you will be required to have read and understood your responsibilities in relation to the safeguarding and data protection policies. You will be asked to sign a declaration before taking on this role and will be expected to undertake basic safeguarding training. You must not be disqualified from acting as a charity trustee.
